NBA Superstar Yao Ming to host Chicago fundraiser on behalf of Earthquake relief

(Chicago, IL)-May 12, 2009- The Yao Ming Foundation at The Giving Back Fund announced that NBA Superstar Yao Ming will host an exclusive cocktail party to raise money for his Foundation at Lao Beijing Restaurant on May 21, 2009 in Chicago, Illinois from 7:00-9:00 PM. More than 80,000 people died and more than 8,000 schoolrooms were destroyed in the earthquake that devastated parts of the country's Southwest, most heavily Sichuan Province.

"Today is the anniversary of one of the worst natural disasters in my country's history. I have not forgotten the many victims and all the rebuilding work that still needs to be done. I ask you to help me in these efforts to aid the people of Sichuan Province," stated Yao Ming. "We are excited to create an intimate event in the great city of Chicago that is centered around our mission of assisting in the earthquake recovery efforts in China. There is much work left to be done."

The Yao Ming Foundation was established in June of 2008 by Chinese NBA Star Yao Ming in response to the devastating 8.0 earthquake in Sichuan Province, China on May 12, 2008. An 8.0 earthquake is the equivalent to energy released from 790 nuclear bombs. More than 8,000 schoolrooms and 185 schools were destroyed during the earthquake. The Yao Ming Foundation has so far committed to rebuilding five schools in the earthquake region. The new earthquake resistant schools will provide top level education for more than 1000 students, many of whom will also board at the schools.
